IAIS's Insurance Capital Standard (ICS) Version 2.0 was released in November 2019 and the monitoring period commences in 2020. The new solvency regime, based on economic valuation of assets / liabilities and risks, will particularly strengthen policyholder protection and improve the competitiveness of insurers. In addition, IFRS 17 on Insurance Contracts finalized in June 2020 requires mark-to-market financial reporting and is closely related to supervisory reporting as well as capital requirements.


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Background and Objectives

The International Association of Insurance Supervisors (IAIS) released the Insurance Capital Standard (ICS) Version 2.0 in November 2019 amongst other reform measures to enable effective cross-border supervision of insurance groups and to contribute to global financial stability. The ICS monitoring period commences in 2020. The new solvency regime, based on economic valuation of assets /liabilities and risks, will particularly strengthen policyholder protection, and improve the competitiveness of insurers. In addition, IFRS 17 on Insurance Contracts which was finalized in June 2020 requires mark-to-market financial reporting and is closely related to supervisory reporting as well as capital requirements. These internationally developed standards are important for insurers as it is influencing local regulatory requirements that are driving insurance market investor behaviours and are becoming worldwide standards. This highly interactive workshop where industry players and regulators will be able to interact aims to provide a deeper understanding of IFRS 17 and provide a practical approach to understanding the standards and its effects on insurers.

The objective of the workshop is to provide participants the opportunity to understand the latest standards, implications and challenges faced in implementing these new standards as well as express / exchange their views on the global capital standards with their peers, key opinion leaders and experts in the field.
